Austin has never been more dangerous than it is today. This is rapidly eroding our quality of life. Did you know District 5 has the highest number of vehicle thefts in Austin? It's true.

Homeless people suffering from drug and alcohol abuse, and mental illness are camping next to neighborhoods and school playgrounds (Joslin Park and the Ben White Blvd. underpass near Menchaca Road).

We must also stand by our Police. Mistakes can be made when dealing with tense situations. I agree with strict accountability for chronic misbehavior. I also believe we should focus more on recurring training for all officers and remedial training for those who fall short of established standards of conduct. There are nearly 300 vacant police jobs in Austin today, now imagine Austin with 400 or 500 vacancies. If Austin continues to be a toxic environment for law enforcement, no one will want to be a police officer in Austin no matter how much we pay them.
